# UN MINE ACTION SERVICE

## Implementation of the UN Strategy

- Reduction of death and injury by at least 50 percent
- Mitigate the risk to community livelihoods and expand freedom of movement in at least 80 percent of the most seriously affected communities
- Integration of mine action needs into national development and reconstruction plans and budgets in at least 15 countries
- Assist the development of national institutions to manage the landmine and ERW threat, and at the same time prepare for residual response capacity in at least 15 countries
