## UNDP's leadership in mine action Ukraine

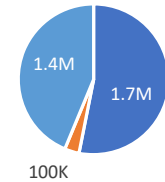
- UNDP in Ukraine for 3 decades
- Feb 2022 had existing MA support to SESU and MOD and had been coordinating the Mine Action Sub-Cluster since 2015
- In April/May 2022 UNDP/UNMAS deployed advisors for a joint intervention. Conclusion that UNMAS would disengage in Ukraine and support UNDP remotely
- UNDP MA working methods places a strong focus on:
  - Provide strategic advice strengthening national sustainable structures and capacities
  - Capacity development and links between humanitarian, development and peace sector
  - Coordination and cross-cutting issues of Gender, Environment and Inclusion
  - Through advocacy promotes adherence to the key disarmament treaties and implementation of action plans

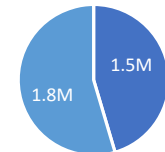

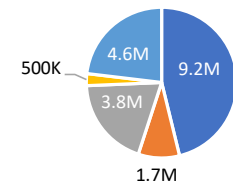

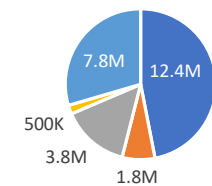
Hard Pipeline

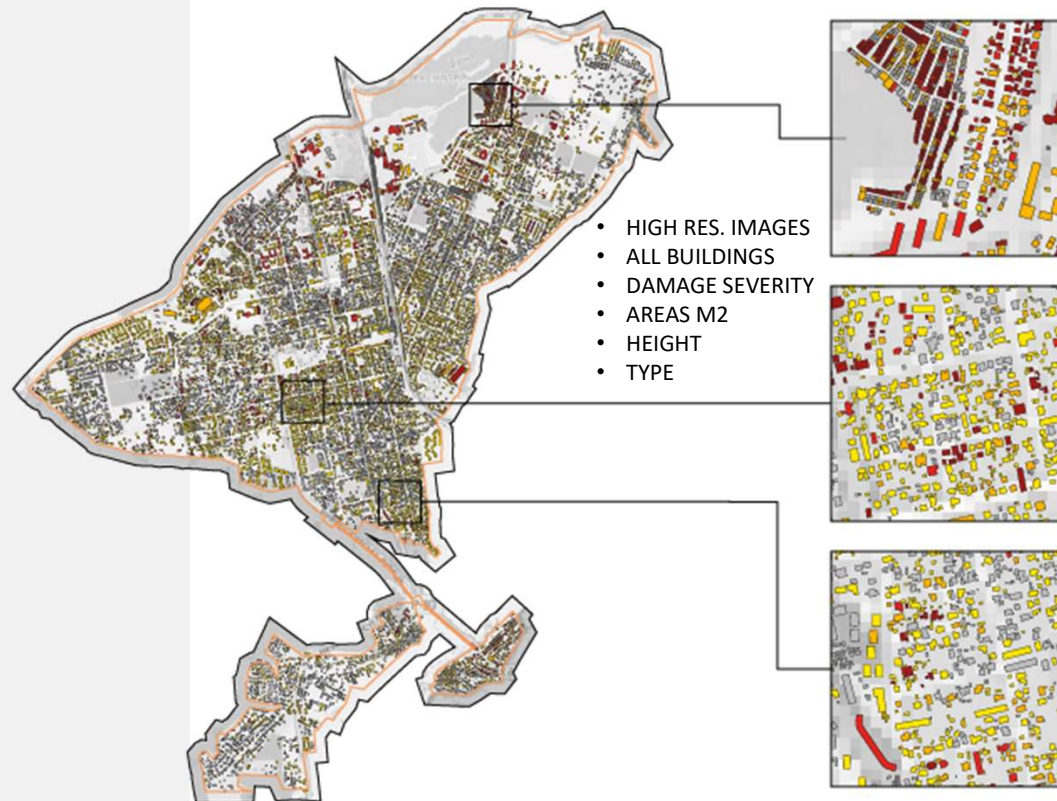
