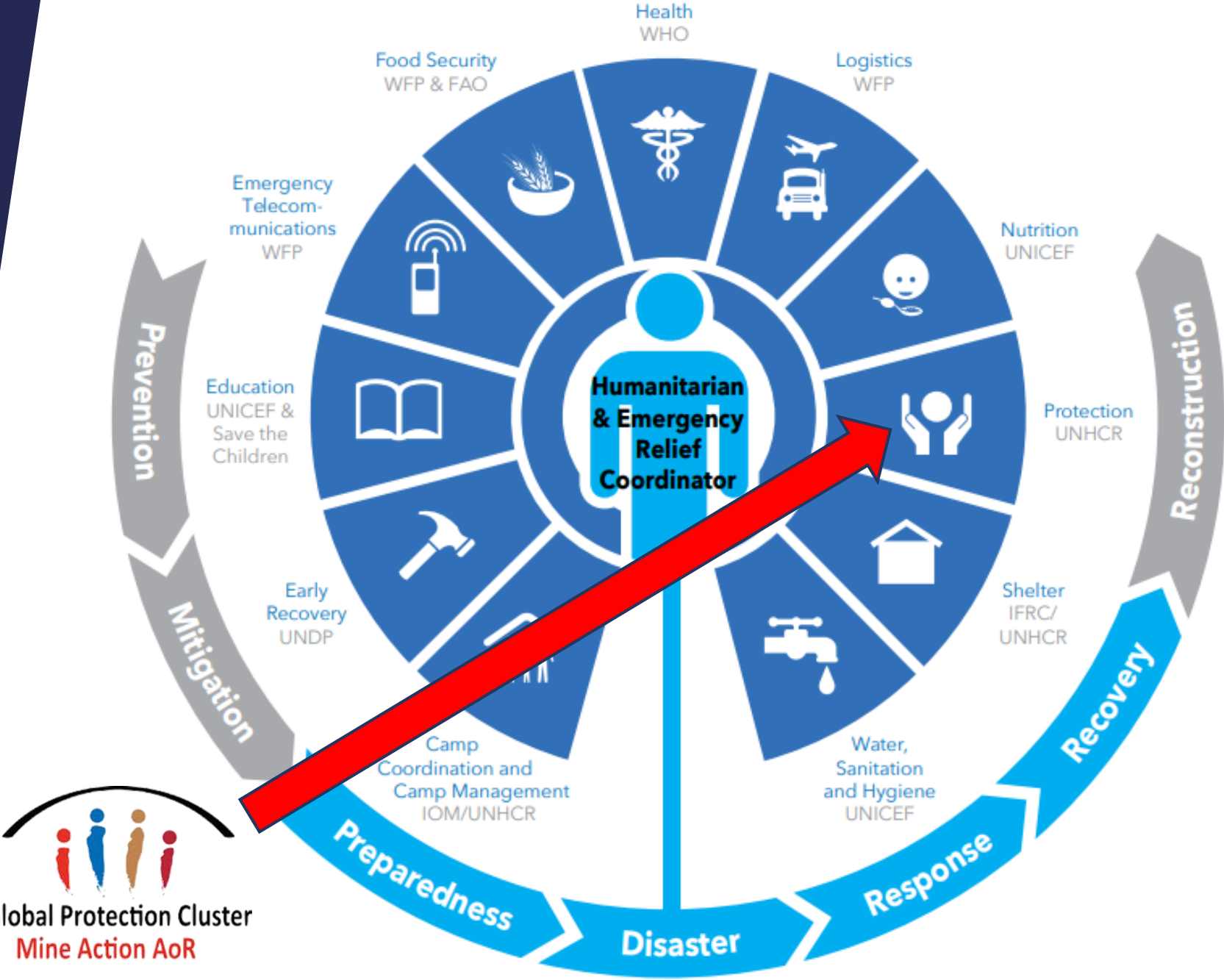


# Mine Action and Global Humanitarian Architecture



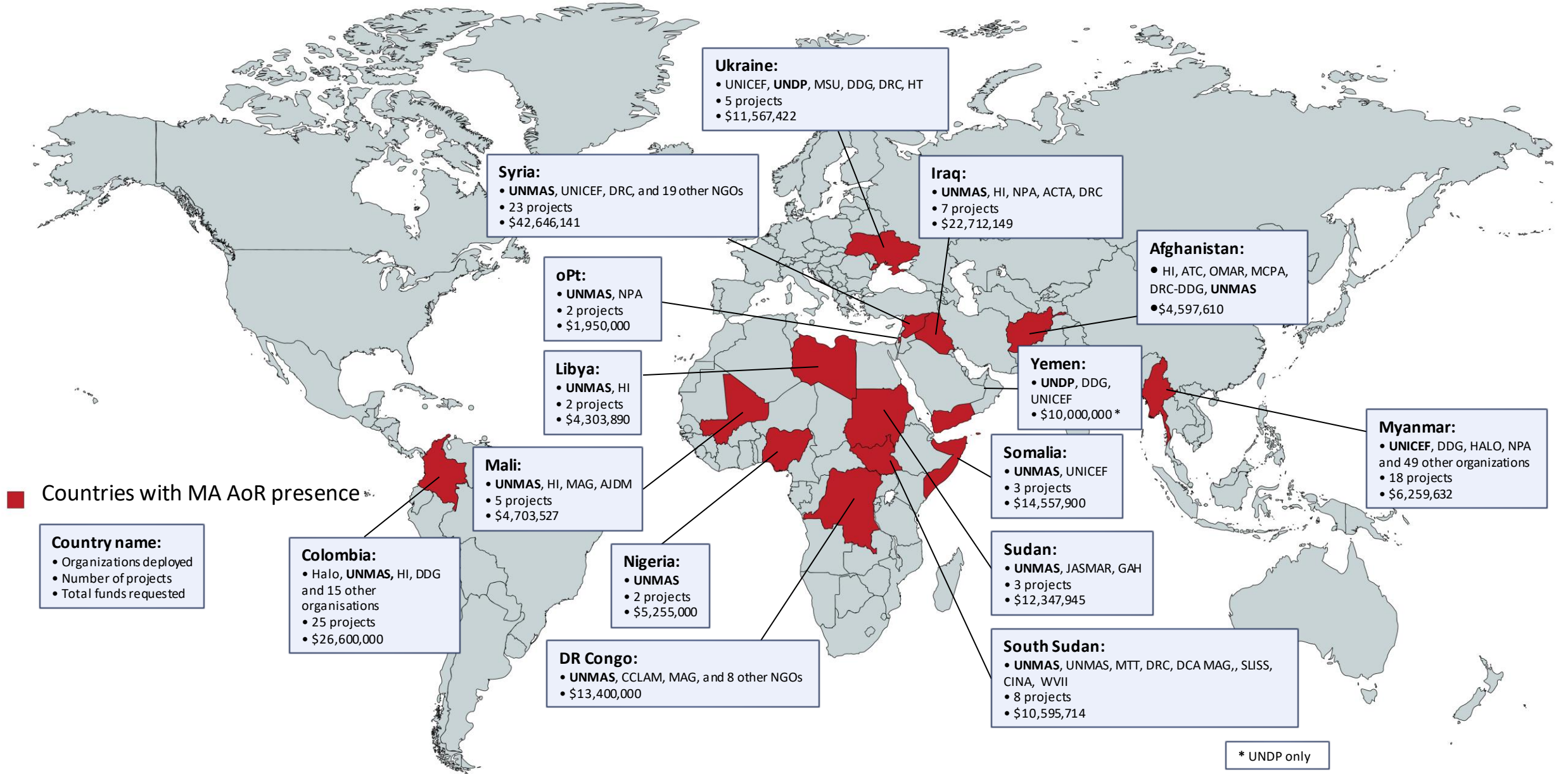
# What is the Mine Action Area of Responsibility ?

- ▶ **Vision:** a world in which people in emergencies are protected from explosive ordnance and in which victims have access to victim assistance.
- ▶ **Goal:** a partnership of organizations that works together towards a shared goal of ensuring predictable, well-coordinated and equitable provision of all pillars of humanitarian mine action for populations affected by explosive ordnance in humanitarian crises.
- ▶ **Leadership:** at the global level UNMAS and an NGO co-lead (Humanity & Inclusion).
- ▶ **Members:** UN entities, NGOs, and academic institutions.

## Key functions:

- ▶ Advocate for coherent and visible mine action in humanitarian responses
- ▶ Bring together mine action actors to share knowledge and maximize resources
- ▶ Be the mine action voice in broader humanitarian policy dialogue
- ▶ Develop strategic partnerships with other clusters or sectors

# Prevention/Response to impact of explosive ordnance on children

UNICEF, UNMAS, UNHCR, Save the Children, HI prepared requested a ProCap deployment. Objective to improve inter agency/cluster collaboration around four “collective outcomes” that are **part of core mandates** of each the respective clusters/agencies;

- ▶ Prevention (essentially reducing rate of children killed and maimed by EO)
- ▶ Reducing Mortality (Increasing survival rate of children who have had an accident)
- ▶ Increased Personal Capacity (medium term health services to improve physical and mental health for child survivors)
- ▶ Social Inclusion (Range of activities, including assuring children gain access to education)
