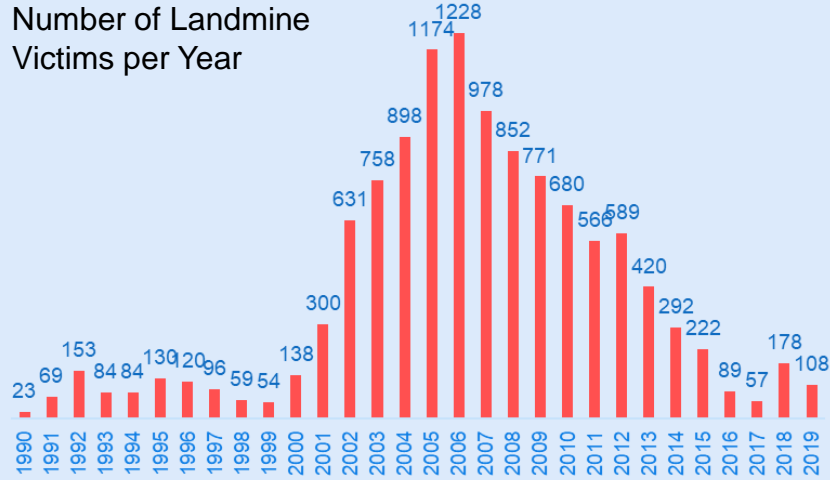

- 11.801 Registered Victims
- 80% survive the accident
- Victims:

 - 40% Civilians (10% Children)

Persistence of the use of anti-personnel mines of an improvised nature by Non-State Armed Groups.

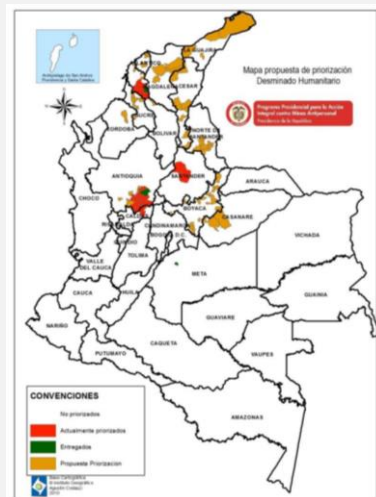
Territories without security conditions to advance in humanitarian demining operations.

Rise of the Humanitarian Demining Operations from 2014 to 2019

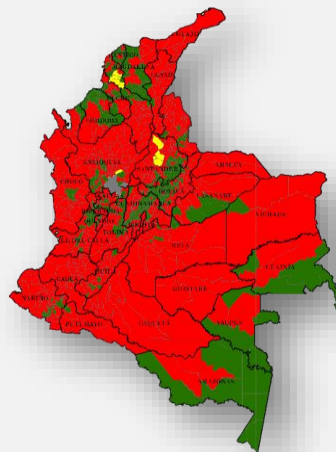
Action Plan 2014 – 2016

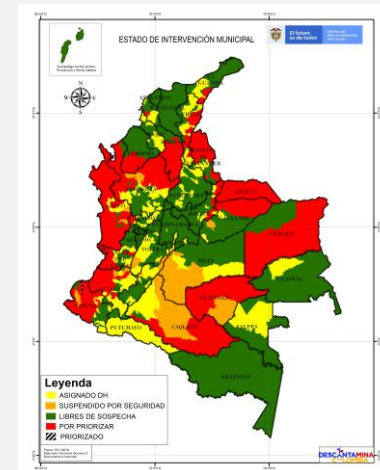
Strategic Plan 2016-2021

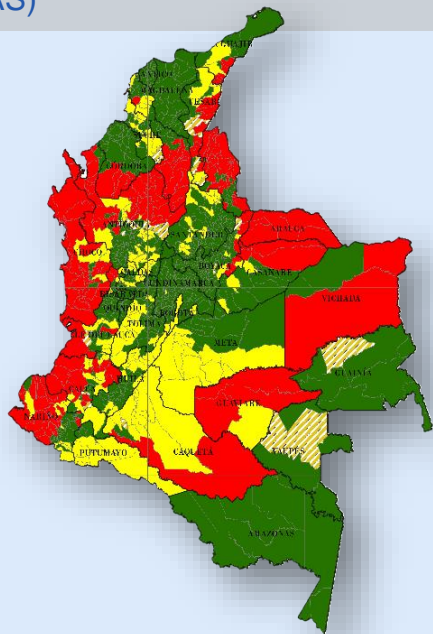

Governments adopt global anti-landmine action plan

The Convention's President, Ambassador Osman Abufatima Adam Mohammed, Deputy Permanent Representative of the Sudan to the UN in Geneva, held a meet-and-greet with the Coordinate Committee on 18 December.

Sudan leads the first year of implementation of the recently-adopted **Oslo Action Plan**, and the work of the Convention in 2020 culminating with the Eighteenth Meeting of the States Parties (18MSP), taking place in November in Geneva. The Coordinating Committee will meet again on 31 January in a full day retreat to discuss their work in 2020.
