KEY MESSAGES

Key Message 01

Information Management

- Analyse casualty data to identify areas where emergency services need to be strengthened & share this data with health actors.
- Monitor and share innovation in health practices of relevance to mine action



Key Message 02

Strengthen local response by medics

- Train EORE community liaisons, deminers, and medics to train layperson first responders
- Act as implementing partners for WHO CFAR and Stop the Bleed trainings



Key Message 03

Strengthen the role of mine action sector in policy

- Promote the development of a National Mine Actions Standard on Victim Assistance in Mine Action
- Implement IMAS 13.10, including through:
 - Reaching out to actors responsible for emergency medical services
 - Promoting implementation in areas with high mortality rate
 - Participating in inter-ministerial and multistakeholder coordination mechanism
 - Development of a national action plan to ensure those services needed are being programmed and budgeted for
 - Advocacy on rights of persons with disabilities in line with the CRPD.



Key Message 04

Advocacy on human rights

- Challenge governments to implement the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.
