### Final Pledge List

Country	Type of Pledge
Australia	Funds to establish a mobile advisory team on explosive hazard mitigation to 5 missions in Africa. Increase female participation in missions to 25%. Confirm existing strategic air-lift pledge.
Bangladesh	Increase the number of female peacekeepers.
Belarus (Did not speak)	1 x Force Protection Platoon.
Belgium	Mobile Training Teams for MINUSMA for four six weeks training.
Benin (Did not speak)	1 x Explosive Ordnance Disposal platoon (in 2 years); 1 x Infantry Battalion, and 1 x Level 2 hospital (in 3 years).
Bosnia and Herzegovina	United Nations Military Experts in Mission courses; Explosive Ordnance Disposal course; Demining Course; United Nations Police Course; Staff Officers Course, Tactical Protection of Civilians course; Utility of Gender in Peace Support Operations course. Increase the participation of female military.
Brazil	Training in Jungle Operations for MONUSCO Contingents.
Canada	Financial contributions of approximately \$45 million to UN Departments, Funds and Programmes for peacekeeping agenda including increase of female participation in field missions.
China	Host an exercise for peacekeeping troop-contributing countries in 2020.
Djibouti (Did not speak)	1 x Francophone Formed Police Unit (15% female), with a swat team embedded; 1 x Hospital level, Staff Officers and Individual Police Officers; and the training center for francophone countries.
Egypt	Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Company for MINUSMA, Special Forces Company, 2 x Formed Police Units, 1 x Aeromedical Evacuation Team, plus Cairo Peacekeeping Training Center services for Trainer of Trainers courses on Protection of Civilians and translation of Protection of Civilians training materials to Arabic. Mine-resistant vehicles for MINUSMA. Correctional Officers, Mobile Training Teams to train on Sexual Exploitation and Abuse.
El Salvador (Did not speak)	Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Aviation Unit to Mali.
Ethiopia	2 x Infantry Battalions and 8 Staff Officers for Yemen. More Staff Officers and Individual Police Officers.
Finland	Host United Nations Military Experts in Mission course in 2019 and 2020 with gender parity and deploy MTT with Sweden to MINUSMA in 2019. Financial contribution to the Elsie Initiative for Women in Peace Operations.

France	Training for 30,000 francophone African troops for future peacekeeping operations. Trainer of trainer's course in Paris for francophone staff officers. Financial contribution for equipment transfers to other countries.
The Gambia	1 x Infantry Battalion, 1 x Force Protection Company, 1 x Military Police Company, Staff Officers and Military Observers.
Germany	Mobile Training Teams for pre-deployment training. Cooperation with Peacekeeping training centers in Ghana and Mali. Financial contribution of \$15 Million to the Peacebuilding Fund.
Greece	9 training courses with 5 slots in each for foreign students.
Guatemala	1 x Special Forces Company, 1 x Military Police unit and 1 x Engineering Unit, and military observers and staff officers. UN Course at the training center.
Indonesia	Confirm the current Peacekeeping Capability Readiness System pledge of 1 x Engineers Company, 1 x Signals Coy, 1 x Military Police Unit, 1 x Demining / Explosive Ordinance Disposal Unit, 1 x Transport / Logistic Unit. Increase female participation. In the near future, to pledge in the Peacekeeping Capability Readiness System 1 x Mechanized Battalion and 1 x medical Team.
India	Reaffirmed current Peacekeeping Capability Readiness System pledges of Infantry Battalion, Engineering Company, Military Police Company and Signal Company.
Ireland	Conduct 2 courses on International Protection of Civilian, host a Buddy First Aid medical course, and conduct 2 Counter Improvised Explosive Device Training and Mine awareness training programs in Burkina Faso in association with United Nations Mine Action Service in support of the Sahel G5 Taskforce, and deliver two mission tailored UN Staff Officer Training course funding personnel from certain Troop Contributing Countries.
Israel	Several pledges related to United Nations Medical Services (remote advisory, training and capacity building), support with camp security assessments in Peacekeeping Missions in Africa, and consultancy on integration of technological security equipment in peacekeeping.
Italy	Military and Police courses for individual deployments and units' specialists (e.g. Female engagement teams, Protection of Civilians and gender perspective). Confirming existing pledges in the Peacekeeping Capability Readiness System.
Japan	Mobile training and Training of Trainers course for Rapid Deployment of Enabling Capabilities Project. Contribute to United Nations peacekeeping medical field and financial. Contribution for United Nations peacekeeping capability readiness system. Consider dispatching female staff officers to UNMISS Headquarters.
Malawi	1 x Infantry Battalion for the Peacekeeping Capability Readiness System Rapid Deployment Level.
Mexico	Increase in female participation as individual staff officers and military observers, joint training center courses in 2020 also for foreign personnel.
Mongolia	1 x Infantry Battalion for 2019 to the Peacekeeping Capability Readiness System Rapid Deployment Level. Increase number of individual military contributions especially female officers.
Morocco (Did not speak)	40 Military Experts (including women), translation of training materials into Arabic and French; Level 4 Hospital, triangular cooperation offers to provide training sessions (National Investigation Officers on Sexual Exploitation and Abuse, engineering, Medical and Logistics), deployment of Mobile Training Teams (Logistic, Protection of Civilians and Medical).

Netherlands	Financial contribution to the Elsie Initiative for Women in Peace Operations, funding for the United Nations Peacekeeping Intelligence Policy (phase 3) and for the establishment of the UN's Light Coordination Mechanism.
Nepal	Host courses for capacity building to other Member States. Elevate 1 x Infantry Battalion, 1 x Engineering Company and 1 x Formed Police Unit in the Peacekeeping Capability Readiness System in 2020.
Nigeria	1 x Infantry Battalion, 1 x Quick Reaction Force, 1 x Force Protection Company, 1 x Engineer Company, 1 x Signal Company and 1 x Military Police Company.
Norway	1 x Specialized Police Team to MINUSMA.
Pakistan (Did not speak)	1 x Infantry Battalion; 1 x Quick Reaction Force Company; 1 x Force Protection / Force Headquarters Support Company; 1 x Engineer Company; 1 x Signal Company; Military Observers; Military Staff Officers. Organization of Female Military Observers Course, Counter-Improvised Explosive Device training, Provision of training teams to other Troop Contributing Countries at the Training Center in Entebbe, Uganda and training of Military Observers, Staff Officers and Protection of Civilians.
Philippines	90 military observers and staff officers, 1 x Force Headquarters Support Unit, and 1 x Aeromedical Evacuation Team to the Peacekeeping Capability Readiness System. Increase of female participation.
Portugal	Initiative to conduct pre-deployment training and to support medical training efforts. Meteorological and geographic information systems support.
Republic of Korea	Offer to host the next Peacekeeping Ministerial; Availability of the Peacekeeping Training Center for 5 years for Trainer of Trainers; host Senior Mission Leaders' Course in the second half of 2019. Contribution of light tactical vehicles to African TCCs.
Romania	Utility helicopters pledged in Vancouver Ministerial will be deployed to Mali this year. Training for francophone police officers.
Rwanda	1 x Infantry Battalion for Rapid Deployment in 2019-20, and 1 x Level 2 hospital and 1 x FPU for 2020/2021.
Sierra Leone	1 x Long Range Reconnaissance Task Force Group, 80 Military Experts in Mission (30% female), 1 x Quick Reaction Force, and 1 x Force Protection Company.
Slovenia	Establishment of a training center for the training of uniformed and civilian personnel and specific courses related to peacekeeping operations.
Sweden	1 x Infantry Company (Long Range Reconnaissance/Quick Reaction Force) to Gao for 2020. Mobile Training Team to MINUSMA with focus on enhancing the military skills of contingents to operate in a high threat environment. 2 x Specialized Police teams in MONUSCO and MINUSCA. Funds for UN peacekeeping manual developments. Funding and slots for officers to participate in courses at the Nordic Center for Gender in Military Operations (NCGM).
Thailand	1 x Engineering Company and host UN courses at the peacekeeping training center.
UK	£1,000,000 financial contribution to Elsie Initiative for Women in Peace Operations.
United States	Donation of \$13 million to Bangladesh peacekeeping Unmanned Aircraft Systems project
Zambia	1 x Medium Utility Helicopter unit for rapid deployment level of the PCRS, 1 x Infantry Battalion, 1 x Special Forces Company and 1 x Engineering Company.
